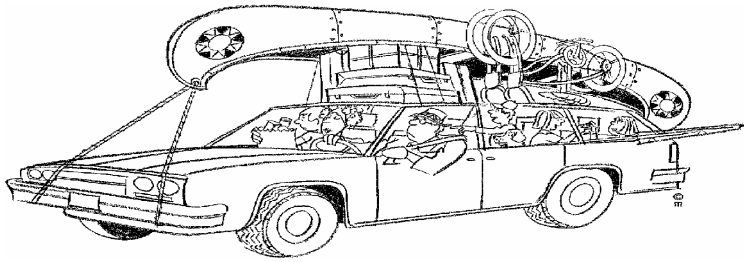


HOW DO I GET A CAMPSITE?



There are 3 ways to get a campsite:

Do not remove any items from a campsite, please ask park personnel for assistance.

1) Reservations

To reserve a campsite, reservations must be made at least 14 days in advance. The minimum stay is 7 nights (Sunday to Sunday only). We will hold your campsite until you arrive. **If you leave and remove your equipment from the site prior to the end of your reservation, we will consider the site vacant.**

2) First Come / First Serve

First come/first serve camping is for visitors camping on a nightly basis. For example, camping Friday night through Saturday or Sunday, and camping during the week. **This is how you will get a campsite if you do not have reservations.**

- 1) Check campsite reservation postings located on the information center (at park entrance), by the office door, and on the campsite post. Write down the sites **not reserved**, and then go to campground. Please note: Reservations posted at these locations are updated weekly; **campers must check the campsite post at the campsite for a reservation tag.**
- 2) After you are certain the site is not reserved and if there is no equipment on the site, you may place your vehicle, camper, erected tent, or trailer on the site. One of these items must be on the campsite before you can get registered and **equipment must stay on the campsite during the entire visit.** Otherwise, if equipment is removed the campsite is open for first come/first serve. **You may not pay for a site before your tent, camper, trailer, or vehicle is placed on the site.**

3) Holding A Campsite

Holding a campsite is for visitors who want to set up their equipment on a first come/first serve basis early in the week to have a campsite at a later date. Basically, “lay claim” to a campsite.

- 1) Follow steps 1 and 2 under “First come/First serve”.
- 2) Write your name and phone number on a piece of paper and clip it to the campsite post.
- 3) Campers must pay for the nights they are holding the site as well as the nights they will physically be occupying the site. You do not have to pay for the site on the day you leave your equipment, you can pay when you come back to begin your stay. **You will be charged for each night that your equipment is on the site.**
